A brief question and answer period followed the formal presentation.

This meeting was the annual outing of this Section, and included an inspection of this facility, followed by a presentation by Mr. George Tozer, Vice President of Metcalf & Eddy at the Preston Beach Motor Inn in Swampscott. There were approximately fifty members

and guests in attendance at the inspection and thirty-seven in attendance at the dinner meeting. Mr. Tozer presented a paper on the design and background of the Swampscott sewage treatment plant which uses the Dorr Oliver fluidized bed system for sludge incineration.
