Thus on the national, state and local levels, events continue to occur that could directly affect not only engineers but the general public as well. Let's make a special effort to keep abreast of these happenings and to make our voice heard.

On the technical side, this Journal provides a unique means to inform our professional colleagues of important engineering work. Although the ASCE has technical division Journals which also publish technical papers, our Journal provides the opportunity for our members to publish their high quality work.
